Does God Hate?

"The Lord tests the righteous, but his soul hates the wicked and the one who loves violence." Psalm 11:5

You have probably heard someone say, "God hates the sin but loves the sinner". It sounds magnanimous but the problem is the statement can lead to a misunderstanding of who God loves and hates.

Yes, God hates. When the Bible does speak of God's hatred, the object of His hatred is sin and wickedness. Proverbs 6:16–19 lists seven things the Lord hates: pride, lying, murder, evil plots, those who love evil, false witnesses, and troublemakers. Notice that this passage does not include just things that God hates, it includes people as well. The reason is simple, sin cannot be separated from the sinner except by the forgiveness available in Christ alone. God hates lying, yes, but lying always involves a person who chooses to lie. God cannot judge the lie without also judging the liar. Look what Psalm 5:5 says about God, "You hate all evildoers" (ESV) and Psalm 11:5 is even harsher, "The wicked, those who love violence, he hates with a passion."

Before a person repents and believes in the Lord Jesus Christ, he is an enemy of God (Colossians 1:21). Yet, even before he is saved, he is loved by God (Romans 5:8). The question then becomes what happens to someone who spurns God's love, refuses to repent, and stubbornly clings to his sin? The answer is God will judge them, because God must judge sin, and that means judging the sinner. These are the "wicked" whom God hates, those who persist in their sin and rebellion, even in the face of the grace and mercy of God in Christ.

The problem is that we try to compare our love and hate with how God loves and hates. We can only understand hatred from a sinful and broken perspective. We know when we hate something that it is tainted with sin. When we hear that God hates something we are shocked by it. We cannot love with a perfect love, nor can we hate with a perfect hatred. But God can both love and hate perfectly, because He is God. God can hate without sinful intent. He can hate the sinner in a perfectly holy way and still lovingly forgive the sinner at the moment of repentance and faith.

The good news is that once someone believes in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and repents of their sin they are no longer and enemy of God or hated by Him. They are now His son or daughter and are loved by God forever.

If you have served your time with Jesus, it will be said of you, as it was of Peter and John, "they recognized that they had been with Jesus."

We press the question, "To whom do you belong?" Answer honestly before you fall asleep for the night. If you are not Christ's, you are in a hard service—run away from your cruel master! Enter into the service of the Lord of Love, and you will enjoy a life of blessedness.

If you are Christ's, let me advise you to do four things. You belong to Jesus—obey Him; let His word be your law; let His wish be your will. You belong to the Beloved; then love Him; let your heart embrace Him; let your whole soul be filled with Him. You belong to the Son of God; then trust him; rest on nothing or no one but on Him. You belong to the King of kings; then be decided for Him. Thus even without being marked with a sign everyone will know to whom you belong.
