<u>Serving</u>

The fifth mark of a disciple of Christ is service. In his letter to the church in Rome, Paul, through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, wrote these words, "*For* just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another, but having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: whether prophecy, in agreement with the faith; or service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with generosity; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness (Rom. 12:4-8)." As disciples of Jesus Christ, we were saved to bring Him glory, to live for Him, and even die for Him. Yet far too many believers think too highly of themselves. They want to be served instead of serving others. It is sinful not to use our gifts to serve others. In his book Spiritual Disciplines for Christian Life, Whitney writes, "Two of the deadliest of our sins—sloth and pride—loathe serving."

When believers are born-again, they receive a gift from the Holy Spirit, and as Paul declared, we are to use those gifts to serve the body. Each believer in the local body must use those gifts, or the body suffers. Serving others takes love and humility.

When Jesus removed his outer garments and washed his disciples' feet, he exhibited a heart of humility and service. God Himself, the creator of heaven and earth, washed the filth of the world off of mere men. His act of humility is an example of every disciple to serve the body of Christ. We are called to humble ourselves to serve Him and our fellow believers. Andrew Murray had this to say about humility and serving, "Look to it that you abase and humble yourselves, and take no place before God or man but that of servant; that is your work; let that be your one purpose and prayer. God is faithful. Just as water ever seeks and fills the lowest place, so the moment God finds the creature abased and empty, His glory and power flow in to exalt and to bless. He that humbleth himself—that must be our one care—shall be exalted; that is God's care; by His mighty power and in His great love He will do it."
