Forsaken!

And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" that is, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?"

Matthew 27:46

When Jesus went to the cross, He knew of the unprecedented cost. It was a momentous event, the first and only time he would be separated from God the Father. But why did this separation have to occur? Scripture tells us that God cannot and will not be associated with evil. The prophet Habakkuk proclaimed, "Your eyes are too pure to see evil, And You cannot look on trouble." (Hab. 1:13).

This is why Jesus had to be both fully God and fully man. He had to be fully God so that He could live a sinless life. He was the lamb without blemish who took away the sins of the World. He had to be fully man so that He could suffer and die. The physical agony of the cross was not the worst of the suffering that Jesus endured on the cross. The worst part was that the Father forsook him. God made Jesus, who knew no sin, to become sin for us. In other words, for every sin that any Christian has or will commit, God punished Jesus for those sins. His wrath against your sin was poured out on Jesus when He hung on the cross.

When Jesus utters the words, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" (Matt 27:46), He quotes from Psalm 22. This is not a cry of despair but a declaration that the prophecy of His suffering is being fulfilled. The first half of Psalm 22 references the suffering of the Messiah, but the second half speaks of the resurrection victory that God will give to the Son.

Jesus was forsaken so that all who would believe could have eternal life. No Christian will ever experience the wrath of God, eternal punishment, or hell. Because He was forsaken, we are forgiven.

# Grace Gems

HUMILITY- (Don Fortner)

"I served the Lord with great humility and with tears"
Acts 20:19

Without humility there is no salvation (Psalm 34:18; 51:17; Isaiah 66:2; Matthew 5:3-5; 18:34; Philippians 3:3). No man can serve or glorify God in this World without this God-given "humbleness of mind" (Colossians 3:12). Anything done for Christ must be done with humility (Matthew 6:3, 5, 16, 33). Humility is not an act, but an attitude of the heart. Humility is brokenness of heart before God by reason of sin and in gratitude for His love, mercy, and grace to sinners in Christ.

Here are five things revealed in the Word of God as characteristics of humility:


1. Humility is a realization of personal unworthiness before God, by reason of one's own depravity and sin (Job 42:5-6; Psalm 51:4-5). It is not a show of words which sound humble, but which are designed to gain praise. Rather, it is a heartfelt unworthiness before the holy Lord God (Luke 18:13; Isaiah 6:5).

- 2. Humility is a renunciation of all merit and personal righteousness in the sight of God (Philippians 3:9). No man's heart is humbled before God so long as he imagines that he has anything by which he may merit God's favor, or that his righteousnesses are more than filthy rags in God's sight (Isaiah 64:6).
- 3. Humility is an inexpressible gratitude of heart to God for His abundant, amazing grace to sinners in Christ (Psalm 116:12, 16). It causes a person to live with a sense of delightful obligation and indebtedness to the Lord God.
- 4. Humility is a willing submission and devotion of one's heart to the Lord Jesus Christ that cries, "Lord, what will you have me to do?" (Acts 9:6). Humility is . . . devotion to Christ as Lord, submission to His providential rule of all things, and a determination of heart to obey and honor Him regardless of cost.
- 5. Humility gladly ascribes the whole work of salvation to God's free and sovereign grace through Christ (1 Corinthians 15:10).
