
Moses is the author of Psalm 90, written around 1400 BC. That makes it the oldest of the 150 Psalms. In verse 11, Moses considers righteous anger and wrath: "Who knows the power of Your anger and Your fury, according to the fear that is due You?" As Moses contemplates that question, he provides a clear example of prayer regarding our mortal lives. We need wisdom to account for our time.

We know these truths. Time flies, life is uncertain, and God judges sin. God does not promise us tomorrow. How many times have you been shocked by the untimely death of a loved one or brother or sister in Christ? It is important, therefore, to value the moments and days He has given us. We cannot know what tomorrow will bring (Proverbs 27:1), so we ought to dedicate today and every day to the Lord. We must live sensibly and with a purpose, yet do so one day at a time.

We should pray for wisdom to live each day that He gives us for Him. Our prayer in the morning should be what David prayed: "Teach me to do Your will, For You are my God; Let Your good Spirit lead me on level ground.!" (Psalm 143:10). Surely, if we consider every 24 hours as something valuable God has entrusted to us, we would faithfully live our days in ways that honor Him (1 Corinthians 4:2).
